III. **Honors and Awards**

Jasmin Nario-Galace graduated with the highest award, the Mother Mary Joseph (MMJ) Award, in College. The MMJ is given to graduates who are outstanding from the point of view of Scholastic Achievement, Leadership Ability and Responsibility and Christian and Social Consciousness. In 2003, when she obtained her doctorate degree, she was given an Academic Excellence Award and was the Class Valedictorian. Her dissertation,

IV. Leadership Experiences

Jasmin is current President of Pax Christi-Pilipinas, a national network of Catholic peacebuilders who promote peace, dialogue and reconciliation based on truth, justice and the common good

She is a Board Member at the Philippine Council for Peace and Global Education (PCPGE). She is Coordinator of the Peace Education Network of the Philippines (PEN). The PEN worked with OPAPP towards the adoption of an Executive Order in the Philippines (EO570) that mandates basic education institutions and teacher-education institutions to integrate peace education in the curriculum.

Jasmin is also Chair of the Subcommittee on Justice and Peace Education under the Catholic Educational Association of the Philippines’ (CEAP) Committee on Programs. As such she trains teachers, students and administrators on peace education, challenging bullying, and on creating peaceable schools, among others. She is also a member of the Technical Working Group formulating the Philippine Catholic Schools Standards for Higher Education Institutions.

She also acted as Coordinator of the CSO Group of the Preparatory Committee that led the formulation of a National Action Plan (NAP) in the Philippines on UN Security Council Resolutions 1325 and 1820 (EO 865). The NAP is meant to increase women’s participation in decision-making in matters of conflict prevention, conflict resolution, peacebuilding and post-conflict resolution. She is Co-convener and past National Coordinator of a civil society network, the Women Engaged in Action on 1325 (WE Act 1325) that helps government implement the NAP. She is Co-convener of #womeninspiringwomen, a loose network of N-PEACE previous awardees and nominees that aims to promote women’s participation in community and national peace processes, conflict prevention and peacebuilding through nonviolent means.

She is currently helping the government and the UN develop a National Action Plan to Prevent Violent Extremism. She facilitated the consultation workshops in Tagaytay and Cebu where participants crafted specific interventions to address the factors that drive radicalization.

In the international front, she is in the Board of the Global Network of Women Peacebuilders based in New York. She represents the Center for Peace Education in the Control Arms Coalition, the Asia-Pacific Women’s Alliance on Peace and Security and UNDP’s N-PEACE.. She is in the International Advisory Council of the International

Action Network on Small Arms (IANSA) and is Co-coordinator of the IANSA Women's Network, also based in New York. She is also in the Steering Committee of Forum Arms Trade based in Washington, D.C and the Centre for Armed Violence Reduction based in Australia.

Jasmin actively worked with members of civil society groups in the global front to lobby for the adoption of an Arms Trade Treaty in the United Nations that is meant to stop the flow of arms to countries and groups that will use such arms to commit gender-based violence, human rights and international human rights laws violations. As a member of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), she also lobbied for the adoption of the Treaty Prohibiting Nuclear Weapons. ICAN was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2017.

In her student days, Jasmin Nario-Galace was Sophomore Council President, Internal Vice-President of the Student Council in her junior year and Student Council President in her senior year. She was also part of the official student publication in college, the Chi-Rho.

IV. Employment History

Jasmin Nario-Galace began her employment as a high school teacher at Immaculate Conception Academy (ICA) in Greenhills, San Juan. After two years at ICA, she transferred to Maryknoll College as a high school teacher. In Maryknoll, now Miriam College, she has served as Coordinator of the Office for Social Concerns and College Registrar. The College Registrar then also served as Admissions Director. She had also taught at the Social Work, International Studies and Child Development Education Departments in the College and in the Miriam Graduate School.

V. Trainings/Seminars

Jasmin Nario-Galace is involved in Peace Education and Advocacy. She has formally trained in peace studies and joined a year-long cross-cultural program with students from 14 other countries under the auspices of the Kroc Institute for International Peace Studies at the University of Notre Dame in Indiana. She has attended numerous trainings on conflict resolution and mediation in the Philippines and abroad. She also participated in the first Southeast Asian teaching session on international humanitarian law under the auspices of the International Committee on the Red Cross (ICRC).

Jasmin is a trainer in the areas of Peace Education, Conflict Resolution, Peer Mediation, Nonviolence, International Humanitarian Law, Women, Peace and Security, Peace Advocacy, Gender and Disarmament, Humanitarian Disarmament and Educational Psychology and has given these trainings in the Philippines and abroad over the years to various groups and sectors such as educators, students, out of school youth, women, the urban poor, indigenous and faith communities, NGO workers, government workers, local government officials, the religious, young professionals and military and police officers.

She has written articles for the Miriam Faculty Research Journal, Rex Publications (modules for the environment), Impact Magazine, Salesiana Publishers, Inc., the Asian Peace and Conflict Journal and the World Council for Curriculum and Instruction (WCCI) Journal, among several others. She has written a Sourcebook on Conflict Resolution and Peer Mediation published by the Center for Peace Education and has co-authored a study and toolkit entitled “Peace Education Initiatives” published by the United Nations Development Program-Philippines. In September 2008, a Peace Reader, “Peace Education: A Pathway to Peace” which she co-authored with Dr. Loreta N. Castro was also launched. A new edition of the book “Tungo sa Mapayapang Mundo” (Towards a Peaceful World) which she co-authored with Loreta Castro was released in June 2009. It is published by Anvil and National Book Store. She also co-wrote a chapter on the Philippine implementation of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 in the 2010, 2011 and 2012 editions of “Women Count: Civil Society Monitoring Report” published by the Global Network of Women Peacebuilders.
